

On June 30, 2021 Washington State reopened under the [Washington Ready Plan](#).

All industry sectors previously covered by guidance in the Healthy Washington – Roadmap to Recovery or the Safe Start Reopening Plan may return to usual capacity and operations while still following updated [Facial Covering Guidance](#).

Limited exceptions for large indoor events defined as having more than 10,000 simultaneous participants.

Restrictions Applying to Indoor & Outdoor Settings After June 30	
Vaccine Verification / Negative Testing	Recommended, but not required, for large indoor and outdoor events.
Capacity Limitations	No restrictions (except large indoor events*)
Physical Distancing	No requirements
Facial Coverings	Follow current applicable requirements as outlined in: Proclamation 20-25.13 - Healthy Washington, Secretary of Health Order 20-03.2, and LNI Publication F414-179.
Travelers	Follow CDC recommendations and Proclamation 20-83.2 - Restrictions on Travelers.

Important Notes for Motion Picture Productions

- The [Motion Picture Production COVID-19 Requirements](#) are no longer required but can be used as recommendations for set safety.
- Productions will now follow the [Department of Labor & Industries \(L&I\) Coronavirus \(COVID-19\) Prevention: General Requirements and Prevention Ideas for Workplaces](#). *This guidance offers options for fully vaccinated workers to go without a mask, methods for verification of worker vaccination status, choices workers have to continue to mask up and other updated guidance to prevent the spread of COVID-19 on the job. The position of COVID Site Supervisor is no longer a requirement of Washington State, however, productions may continue to find it helpful to employ an individual in this role to help employers meet their obligations to provide a safe and healthy workplace.*

- Union productions must also continue to follow health and safety guidance outlined in their union or guild contracts such as the [Return to Work Agreement](#).
