

What is a Regional Film Liaison?

An individual committed to serve as a bridge between these three entities: 1) a designated region or communities; 2) film productions; and 3) Washington Filmworks.

In most cases this individual is employed/contracted by the county, city, tribe, chamber of commerce, destination marketing organization, economic development council, governmental agency or other entity. In a few cases (such as a board member from one of these entities), a Regional Film Liaison may be a volunteer.

The actual words Film Liaison do not have to be in the job title of the person serving in this role, but it can help, especially when they are interacting with productions.

Here is the definition of what they do. In general, they are expected to interact with Washington Filmworks fairly regularly and share filming information with our team, and we will do the same.

To be recognized by Washington Filmworks as a Regional Film Liaison, an individual should be:

- Appointed or clearly recognized by an organization, town or other local entity
- Willing to work closely and communicate regularly with Washington Filmworks
- Eager to field inquiries related to projects in a timely manner
- Able to be entrusted with confidential information
- Willing to foster a film friendly culture within the local community
- Available to participate in film liaison gatherings, events and trainings organized by Washington Filmworks
- Knowledgeable about local permitting
- Knowledgeable about community resources and assets
- Able to work with local property owners and locations to regularly update entries on the Washington Filmworks location database
- Available outside of traditional business hours
- Willing to coordinate within the destination on visits from representatives of film productions and Washington Filmworks, as appropriate
